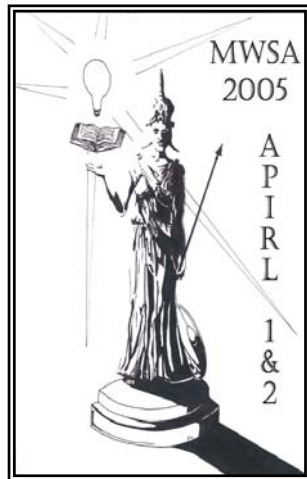

Ms. Ireland will present the address, "Who Needs Women's Studies? You Do!" she the most recognized face of feminism in the United States today. Ms. Ireland will



speak at the Friday Dinner at Meadowbrook Hall. As the longest serving president of the National Organization for Women (1991-2001), Ireland directed countrywide programs on equal opportunity, including initiating the Women-Friendly Workplace Campaign, a national, pro-active project aimed at stopping sexual harassment and other workplace abuses through

public education and public pressure. Widely recognized as a key player in improving social and economic conditions for women in the United States and around the world, Ms. Ireland is adept at helping people recognize the connections among women's rights, civil rights, disability rights, and lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender rights.
