

Veterans Administration Reporting for 0.0 Grades for Unofficial Withdrawal

Veterans' educational benefits are paid on the basis of class attendance and not simply for enrollment in required courses for a declared degree program. Therefore, if a student who receives veterans' benefits stops attending classes before the end of a term, Oakland University is required to report the last date of attendance for unofficial withdrawal to the Veterans Administration to prevent overpayment of educational benefits.

At Oakland University, a student who wishes to drop or withdraw from one or more classes is required to submit a drop slip or a request for withdrawal to the Registration Office by published deadlines in order to receive a grade of W. Students who stop attending classes without following university withdrawal procedure will receive failing grades of 0.0 for their unofficial withdrawal. Instructors will assign 0.0 grades and report a last date of attendance if a student stops attending classes without completing the coursework.

In compliance with V.A. regulations, the last date of attendance for any class in which a failing grade is received will be determined by the university by using one or more of the following criteria:

- The last date in the instructor's record reflecting class attendance
- The last date in the instructor's record that papers were submitted
- The last date in the instructor's record that an examination was completed
- The last date in the instructor's record reflecting academic activity
- The student's reasonable statement of his or her last date of attendance
- The first day of class of the semester, if no other documentation is provided
